## **Parent/Teacher Meetings**

The annual Parent/Teacher meetings have now begun. The vast bulk of these will take place on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November. These are very important meetings as it allows teachers to have an in-depth conversation with parents about the progress of their children.

There are 472 pupils in St Clare's and that's a lot of meetings to arrange. It is so important if you have been given a specific time that this is observed. Every parent will be given the same amount of time. All teachers have met to ensure timetabling for parents with more than one child in the school. This is why again it is vitally important that you arrive on time for the meeting.

### Communication

One of the things we are most proud of in St Clare's is the good line of communication that exists between the school and home. Seesaw plays a major role in this and we hope that everyone has the app on their phones as it is the main means of communication. We also have our social media posts on our website, Facebook page and X formally known as Twitter.

From a safeguarding point of view, we can never allow parents to enter the classrooms while the children are present. If you need to get a message to a teacher, it can be left at the office. You would not want your child's education disrupted because of unscheduled meetings which take place if a parent arrives at the door of the classroom to speak with the class teacher. Parents are reminded that they must remain at the gate and it is a serious breach of safeguarding procedures for any parent to enter the school without a prior appointment. We appreciate your understanding and support in this.

#### **Staff Contact**

We are very eager to maintain good lines of communication with you all. It is vital that we are able to be in contact with you during the school day. There is nothing more important to us than to celebrate the achievements of your child. That is why it is vitally important that you remain in contact with us <u>via seesaw</u> and also to ensure that if you have a change of mobile number or address, that you let the office know immediately. Please note, teachers are instructed not to respond to messages until normal working hours.

Please protect school books by putting lunches in a separate lunch box. Lunches are supervised. Children are allowed crisps at lunchtime only.


