### Whole School Nurture Approach

As a school we have implemented a programme called Nurture in Five this year. All staff have received EA training in this approach and are keen to use it in classes.

'Group Theraplay ®' is great for enhancing self-esteem, regulating emotions and promoting joy and engagement in children. It is also beneficial for children who may be withdrawn or shy and may help build confidence. It can also assist with tactile or sensory issues.

Nurture in Five incorporates activities such as movement, massage, breathing practices and mindful relaxation.

The Nurture Staff, Mrs Corey and Miss Sheridan have incorporated these programmes within The Sunshine Room and are seeing children reap the benefits. Groups of children from P1-P7 have accessed the support within The Sunshine Room and are responding positively to the interactive sessions.

We continue to make good use of our sensory room for those pupils who need some additional regulation. We are very fortunate that these resources are available to us and are administered by such a qualified and dedicated staff.

## **P6 Transfer Meeting**

There will be an initial information session for parents of pupils who intend to sit the Transfer test in November 2025 on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> February from 1.30pm-2.00pm. This will take place in the school assembly hall with the present P6 teachers and led by Mr O'Doherty.

#### **P7**

P7 pupils celebrated the Service of Light on Wednesday  $22^{nd}$  January. This followed a day long retreat held by the youth ministry from Clonard. It was also a very special occasion as for the first time, our P7 children took part in a ceremony at Clonard Monastery itself.

Confirmation will be celebrated on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> February in St Paul's Church beginning at 11.00am sharp. This is a day which the children will remain with their families so it is vitally important that all children are in their seats no later than 10.40am. #### **After School Provision**

#### **Breakfast Club**

We are very proud of the amount of additional provision we make in the school outside of class contact time. Throughout each week there are a range of opportunities for every pupil in the school to access extra activities. Each morning the kitchens prepare delicious breakfasts which are substantial. There is always fresh juice, cereal and toast. In addition to this there are always hot snacks available each morning as follows:

Monday- Boiled Eggs Tuesday- Beans Wednesday- Bacon Thursday- Sausages Friday- Hot pancakes.

As well as this, children get to play games and socialize in an informal environment. It's a wonderful way to begin the day with a hearty meal, good friends and allows our parents to get to work early and save them from having to make breakfast amongst the many other things they do to enable to get their children out to school in the morning. And this is all for the price of £1.50 per day and is open to all pupils from Nursery- P7.

#### **123 CLUB**

At 2 o'clock each afternoon, children from Nursery to P3 can avail of the 123 Club. This facility is for those pupils who have an elder sibling in the school in P4-P7 who finish at 3.00pm. This allows parents to do one pick up in the afternoon as opposed to two. Again the pupils are entertained with games, exercise and songs by our trained staff. The cost is again kept to a minimum of £1.50 per day Tuesday- Friday as the school closes for all pupils at 2.00pm every Monday.

#### **After School Sports**

We have some very gifted sports stars on our staff and they make use of their expertise after school each week to train our pupils in various sports and skills. At present our programme is as follows:

#### **Transition for P1 and Year 8**

This is the time of the year when the enrolment for admissions is open online. Our Nursery places fill up very quickly and we can only take a maximum of 52 pupils. The portal opened on 10<sup>th</sup> January and will **close at 12 noon on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> January**. Any application made after this time will be considered a late submission and will fall outside of the normal criteria selection process. Parents should log in to

The admissions Portal will open for year 8 admissions (Post Primary School) on 28<sup>th</sup> January and will close at 12 noon on 20<sup>th</sup> February.

You will require an email address to be able to register on EA Connect to submit an application.

If your child **has** a formal Statement of Special Educational Needs, there is a separate placements process where the post primary school placement is discussed with you as part of the review of your child's statement, therefore an application should not be made via Admissions on EA Connect.
