# A Focus on our Specialist Provisions Within St Clare's PS

### **Nurture Provision (Sunshine Room)**

Since 2013, the school has been fortunate enough to be funded by the Department of Education to allow for a bespoke Nurture provision. St Clare's PS was one of the first schools to be awarded this training and eleven years later it is still having a huge impact into the lives of the children who attend this small group setting.

In Nurture Groups, there is a special emphasis on language development and communication. As well providing academic teaching, the group is designed to help children develop vital social skills, to develop confidence and self respect.

In the Sunshine Room, Mrs Corey has been there from day one. Mrs Corey is a specially trained teacher for this area and in her years has also amassed a number of accreditations especially within play therapy which is used for many more of our pupils. For many of the previous years, Mrs Lynch acted as the assistant. This year we have welcomed Miss Sheridan as the CA specialist for Nurture.

Of course, the pupils benefit from this expert tuition for one year until they reintegrate into the main body of the school. However, even during their year in the Sunshine Room, there is a positive link with the classrooms the pupils come from and this integration with the base class is a very important part of the process.

There is probably not a happier room in the school than the Sunshine room. A great place to learn and play.

# **SPiM Class (Infinity Room)**

During the summer of 2023 the school had a major building project carried out in order to facilitate the creation of a specialist unit in the school to welcome pupils who have challenges around social and communication issues.

Our specially trained staff welcomed our first pupils to the school in September 2023. Our pupils come from across the city. There are huge demands on the staff and it only works thanks to the outstanding leadership of the teacher in charge Ms Lees and her assistants Ms Saoirse Ginley, Ms LJ Wilkinson and Mrs Theresa Miller.

The secret to the success of the Infinity Room is the ongoing communication with the parents. This is at the centre of the work moving forward to allow us to work in a partnership with parents. It is great to see our pupils in infinity attend classes in music with the rest of our pupils. We hope our pupils continue to thrive in our specialist setting.

A huge thank you to all the parents of our P7 Confirmandi for their participation in the Service of Commitment which took place in the assembly Hall on Tuesday 19th November.
